OVERVIEW

Despite a very challenging year, Rise Against Hunger Africa distributed over 8.5 million nutritious meals and nearly 120 000 Nutri-Go packs to those in need during the Coronavirus pandemic lockdown period, between March 2020 and February 2021. As many of our normal distribution channels were affected by the lockdown, RAH Africa has been collaborating with many other NGOs, disaster relief organisations and community groups to assist in distributing meals to the most vulnerable. By working with other organisations, we have been able to provide meals in all nine Provinces.





The core beneficiary focus of Rise Against Hunger Africa (RAH Africa) are children between the ages of 1 to 6 years. Our ECD Connect program focuses on providing nutritious meals to children through ECD centres linking nutrition and education.

During 2020, due to the Coronavirus pandemic and the hard levels of lockdown, many of these facilities were closed. However, we did manage to reach many of our ECDs and Partner ECDs. We were able to support other crèches with meals during this period.

Thanks to the continued support from our loyal donors, we were able to raise significant funding to assist and support many people whose lives were affected by the C-19 pandemic. As we were not able to engage with our corporate volunteers to pack meals, we employed over 27 people on a contract basis to pack our meals in our warehouses nationally. This also created much needed employment during this time.

Working alongside many other reputable and respected organisations RAH Africa distributed meals in all nine provinces. This included NGOs, Disaster Relief organisations, Community Action Groups and direct response to requests for assistance.







UNIVERSITY SUPPORT

Over the years, the requests to support tertiary institutions has grown significantly. Unfortunately, due to Covid-19 many of these facilities were closed.









Two of the RAH Africa community vegetable garden initiatives, based in Orange Farm and Diepsloot were able to produce much needed fresh vegetables to various communities during this period. The details of the produce distributed will be in our Sustainable Communities Impact Report.
